Dear Parishioners and Friends,

**Philippians** brings us to the 57th book in our Bibles. This brief letter (only 4 chapters) packs quite a bit in its verses. It is obvious that Paul is writing to a community he had come to love and had been very supportive of his ministry, but he is probably writing it from his prison cell of house arrest in Rome near the end of his life. Paul writes a wish (found in today's ordination rite for deacons) that the one who began God's work in them will bring it to completion in them, and he also expresses to them that it matters not whether he himself lives or dies, for Christ will be proclaimed through him in either case (ch. 1); Paul strives mightily for the Philippians' unity among themselves in focusing on one another's needs rather than on each of their own, and he also utters a prayer which captures the very *kenosis* (complete emptying) of Jesus for us on the cross (indeed, this has been set to music and was one of the scriptural passages used at my priesthood ordination back in 1978): we are to shine like stars amidst all of such self-emptying among ourselves (ch. 2); Paul speaks of the true way of Christian salvation in one's breaking with the past as it may hold one back, and he even posts the only "Beware of the Dogs" sign in the Bible as he warns against those "dogs" insisting on practices no longer required to be numbered among God's People—in fact he goes so far as to point to himself as the reformed example that they should follow, and one section of his letter is often used at funerals as it identifies our true homeland as being heaven (ch. 3); and finally he closes with a "Don't Worry, Be Happy" outlook as he thanks his readers for their donations in the past and sends greetings from Caesar's household [which is his imprisoning "host"] (ch. 4). When you finish this book, you will have read 57 (78.1%) of the 73 books of the Bible, yet 1,252 (93.9%) of the 1,334 chapters of the Bible.

This week we mourn the death of the fourth pastor of St. Ambrose Church, James J. Marvin (1971-1995) who died last Sunday morning. Throughout my priesthood I have known him as one who has given his all to whatever he was about, whether it be to his pastoring, his work in and for the diocese, his family or his friends. May he rest in peace, and may we now carry on such practice of commitment as his!

Today, we welcome Basilian Father Thomas Rosica to our 9:45 Mass. Fr. Tom (at whose First Mass then-Pastor Jim Marvin had preached here at St. Ambrose on April 20, 1986) currently ministers in Toronto both on the General Council of the Basilian Fathers and as Chief Executive Officer of Canada's Salt & Light Catholic Television Network. He very graciously hosted me a couple weeks ago in Toronto, and we are grateful for his presence now with us today here in Rochester. Monday is 12 years since Princess Di's death. Tuesday re-starts our Liturgy Committee for the year. Wednesday is the 40th anniversary of the ATM machine in the U.S. (gee, Moon Walk, Woodstock, and ATM all in 1969!). Thursday is Flag Day in Australia. Friday is the Full "Com" Moon. Safe Labor Day next weekend!

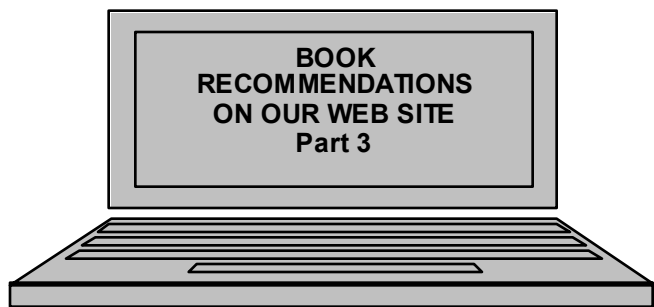

**More book recommendations:**

**Angels A to Z: Second Edition** by Evelyn Dorothy Oliver and James R. Lewis, Visible Ink Press, Canton MI: 2008 (\$24.95). [394 pp.] ISBN 978-1-57859-212-8

It's not often that I read an entire 394-page dictionary cover-to-cover, but this one was hard to put down. Though it comes not from a Catholic publisher and covers much more in the angelic realm than Catholic angelology, it has abundant bibliographical references to Catholic resources and the Doctors of the Church. It covers all nine choirs of Dionysius the Areopagite, and gives examples of each choir and its particular job description. In addition, it tells which named angel is associated with which choir, color, day, month, direction, element, planet, zodiac sign, and tells of the angels of Islam and of an anthroposophical (!) division of angels. A fascinating, comforting, thought-provoking, discussion-starting read!

**Worship: A Primer in Christian Ritual** by Keith F. Pecklers, The Liturgical Press, Collegeville MN: 2003 (\$24.95). [216 pp.] ISBN 978-0-8146-2985-7

Jesuit Father Keith Pecklers teaches liturgy in Rome, and yet this book is meant for the person (lay or ordained) in the pew. He does summer workshops for Seton Hall in New Jersey and makes liturgy something one can really grab on

to—and see the value of: “For the Christian community, praying in common is a non-negotiable and those who do not pray in common with the rest of the body of Christ cannot rightly call themselves ‘Christian.’ They might be very generous, inspired by the life and ministry of Jesus Christ and trying to do the right thing in life, but if they never pray in common with other Christians, they cannot claim that identity” (p. 12). After thoroughly reviewing our ritual’s historical roots, Pecklers concludes that “the credibility and future of the church will depend on its ability to be trans-cultural, contextual, counter-cultural, and its ability to overcome the differences between and among cultures (cross-cultural)” (p. 133). A great book to read as we get ready next year for the release of the newly translated Roman Missal about to be introduced into the English-speaking Church!

**Thank God Ahead of Time: The Life and Spirituality of Solanus Casey** by Michael H. Crosby, O.F.M. Cap., St. Anthony Messenger Press, Cincinnati: 2009 (\$16.95). [256 pp.] ISBN 978-0-86716-919-5

Solanus was a holy Franciscan priest who lived from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century until the middle of the 20<sup>th</sup>. “Above all, Solanus believed, whether one would receive a desired cure or not, one should always give thanks to God. Giving thanks ahead of time—whether it be for healing or continued sufficiency—should characterize true believers” (p. 163). This will be a book that’s hard to put down. You’ll always be wondering what is going to happen to poor old Solanus next. Let him become your companion for the more challenging aspects of your life!

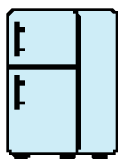

### Building Peace with Justice for August 30, 2009

Today we hear in Deuteronomy: "...what great nation has statutes and decrees that are as just as this whole law which I am setting before you today?" Jesus summed up this great law as wholehearted love of God and one another.

There has been much in the news lately about justice and human rights especially with regard to immigration. In his 2001 World Day of Peace message, Pope John Paul II said, "In order to build the civilization of love, dialogue between cultures must work to overcome all ethnocentric selfishness and make it possible to combine regard for one's own identity with understanding of others and respect for diversity."

Reflection: How can dialogue help us move to understand one another better so that together we can shape laws that work for all?

### Abortion Mandates & Health Care Reform:

On July 17, an action alert supported by the USCCB was issued encouraging people to insist that any health care reform bill must **exclude** mandated coverage for abortion and **uphold** laws that restrict abortion funding and protect conscience rights. Details of this action alert are at [www.nchla.org/actiondisplay.asp?ID=276](http://www.nchla.org/actiondisplay.asp?ID=276).

Both the House and Senate Committees rejected amendments that excluded mandated coverage for abortion. The Senate subcommittee rejected amendments to maintain current state laws limiting and regulating abortion. The President, asked about abortion during press conferences, has said he does want to deal with the "distraction" of the abortion issue.

The position of the Catholic bishops as articulated by Bishop William Murphy is that, "No health care plan should compel us or others to pay for the destruction of human life, whether through government funding or mandatory coverage of abortion."
