Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Before I go into items for this week, I simply have a few reflections on the week gone by (I'm writing this on Tuesday morning, the 2nd of March). It is always amazing to witness so much life going on around our very vibrant parish. The wonderful first of the four Lenten soup suppers (at St. James), the awesome Fruit of the Vine event (at St. John's), and the dedicated Festival Committee already meeting in preparation for this coming June (at St. Ambrose) revealed many ardent volunteers working side-by-side from all three of our sites for all three of our sites and the many activities that are so much a part of our communal life as a parish. May we spend at least a few moments of our daily Lenten prayer in the "Thank You" mode giving praise to our God for so much divine vigilance over (and camaraderie in) all we are about here at Peace of Christ!

Many thanks to all who play a part in these matters so caringly for us all!

Monday is the birthday of David Tedesche who is one of our diocesan seminarians studying over in Rome and who worked with us here at Peace of Christ Parish doing pastoral work just a few years ago. Keep him in your prayers, and if you e-mail any greetings for him to our parish e-mail address (rpeace@dor.org), we'll be happy to forward them on for you.

Tuesday brings us to our next special 5:30 P.M. Lenten weekday Mass and Soup Supper. This one is at St. John's. Three more modern saints will be our focus (Isaac Jogues, Kateri Tekakwitha, Pedro Arupe) and the word for this entire week is "Vigilance."

Wednesday is the 100th anniversary of Film Director D. W. Griffith's finding the perfect place for making movies. It was a little town known as Hollywood, California. And the rest is history! HAITI AND THE PEACE OF CHRIST PARISH



We are reintroducing to some and introducing to others, a grassroots organization serving the needs of Haiti, known as Haiti Outreach Pwoje Espwa (H.O.P.E.)

So, remember in 1996, the Local Leadership told the Rochester contingency, that they needed a Clinic. It happened with an Annual Budget of \$70,000, which money flowed from Rochester.

In 2002, the Rochester contingency was told that two Seminarians needed financial backing. The money flowed from Rochester.

Then, the biggest request ever came. The local leadership informed Rochester that a hospital was now needed with an Annual Budget of \$200,000. Did Rochester balk? No Way! We partnered with the Haitian Ministry of Health to run a Hospital. The Clinic grew into a Hospital!

Stay tuned to next week's bulletin to learn what H.O.P.E. is doing in Haiti to aid in the relief efforts of the recent earthquake.

BUILDING PEACE WITH JUSTICE

"Be patient," the gardener says to the orchard owner in today's Gospel. "Let me care for the young trees, and they will bear fruit in the future." Perhaps the gardener's plea for delayed gratification can speak to us today, even in our nation's global actions. We have too often chosen dramatic and swift military action instead of the challenging work of international diplomacy.

Peaceful resolution of conflicts takes time – time to develop relationships and build trust. Yet it is time well spent if it prevents violence and loss of life. During his 2008 visit to the White House, Pope Benedict XVI expressed his hope that the U.S. would lead the world in nonviolent resolution to conflicts: "I am confident that . . . concern for the greater human family will continue to find expression in support for the patient efforts of international diplomacy to resolve conflicts and promote progress."

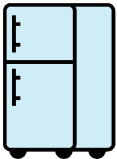
