At Peace of Christ Parish, we offer a variety of Christian formation and spiritual growth opportunities for people of all ages. Our Family Faith Program is designed for busy families whose children are currently attending public schools from PreK 4 to Grade 12. The Diocese of Rochester requires children to attend 30 hours of catechesis yearly.

Participation in the program means a commitment to both parts of the program: FAMILY GATHERINGS and ONGOING CATECHESIS whether Monday Traditional Classes, Home Study or the Summer Session.

OUR MISSION

The Faith Formation (Religious Education) Program of Peace of Christ Parish, inspired by the love of Jesus Christ, is committed to building a strong Foundation of Faith for children, youth and adults in the parish. We accomplish this by offering meaningful prayer, devotional, sacramental and liturgical opportunities to deepen and strengthen their faith experience.

OUR GOALS


- ◆ Bring about in our children a deeper knowledge and love of Jesus Christ and a growing faith in Him
- ◆ Prepare the children to receive the sacraments
- ◆ Prepare the non-baptized children and youth to be received into the Catholic Church through the RCIA process
- ◆ Foster and enhance a cooperative effort between the parents and catechists in the children's faith formation
- ◆ RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is adapted for children of catechetical ages (age 7 and up who have not been baptized) and is the normative way for children and youth to be initiated into the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Rochester. HOME STUDY

This option supports the belief that the family is the Domestic Church where parents/guardians are the primary formers of faith in their children. The Home Study option allows parents/guardians to work at their own pace with their child throughout the year. An age-appropriate textbook will be provided for each child, along with material that helps parent/guardians in teaching multiple children of different ages within the same household. Parents/guardians are provided with a training session and ongoing support which includes a parent/guardian meeting in the fall for material distribution and training, as well as additional opportunities for community connection and student accountability.

FAMILY GATHERINGS

These gatherings are in integral part of the Religious Education Process. It involves families enrolled in the Monday Evening Classes and the Summer Session. SUMMER SESSION

Children and youth PreK 4 — Grade 9 spend a week with us during the month of July. It is a time to learn on a deeper level the teachings of the Catholic Faith. Each year, a pillar of our diocesan religious standards are explored through use of a spiral curriculum. In this way, children across all grade levels explore the same faith topics, but with age-appropriate lessons and materials.

In addition, our catechists use only the most engaging, effective resources to explore these topics with your children, such as the Alive in Christ program by Our Sunday Visitor; the Catholic Handbook for Youth from St. Mary's Press for youth in Grades 6-8; and the Catholic Faith Handbook for teens in Grades 9-12. Children and youth who attend this session do not need to attend the Monday Evening Classes. Please note: if your child attends our Summer Session, he/she receives 25 hours of catechesis towards the required 30 hours of yearly faith formation. Families are expected to attend all four family gatherings that are held throughout the school year.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

The liturgical life of the Church revolves around the sacraments, with the Eucharist at the center. "The sacraments are efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church," by which divine life is given to us and celebrated.

RECONCILIATION

In the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, also called confession, we meet the Lord, who wants to grant forgiveness and the grace to live a renewed life in him. In this sacrament, he prepares us to receive him free from serious sin, with a lively faith, earnest hope, and sacrificial love in the Eucharist.

Diocesan policy mandates that children must first receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before preparing for the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

FIRST COMMUNION

According to Diocesan guidelines, a child should have completed a year of Religious Education, either in a parish program, or a Catholic school, and be currently enrolled in a program to prepare to receive a sacrament. A total of 30 hours/year of catechesis is required for all children and adolescents in Gr. K—12.

JUNIOR AND SENIOR HIGH YOUTH GROUPS

- **Junior High Youth Group:** Our program for middle-school/junior high catechesis (youth in Grades 6-8) integrates all of the 8 Components of a comprehensive Youth Ministry as outlined in the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: *Renewing the Vision*, plan for youth ministry including: advocacy, catechesis, community life, evangelization, justice and service, leadership development, pastoral care and prayer/worship. The program for youth utilizes two primary texts: *The Catholic Connections Handbook for Middle Schoolers*, Second Edition and the *Catholic Youth Bible*, both by St. Mary's Press. The themes explored during these three years are the Old Testament, the New Testament and Church History/the Holy Spirit.
- **Senior High Youth Group:** This also integrates the ideals for the USCCB's *Renewing the Spirit* and is supported by two primary texts; *The Catholic Faith Handbook for Teens* and the *Breakthrough Bible*, both by St. Mary's Press. Additionally, youth explore the YOUCAT to find answers to their questions about their lives and our faith. The focus during these four years is on putting our faith into action through discipleship/Catholic Social Teachings.
